

LeTourneau University Aviation Flight Advising Tips

If you are new to LETU, flight class selection can be confusing! Your academic advisor is here to help. The flight course sequence takes seven semesters, starting with the semester you take Flight Science I. You may or may not be in Flight Science I your first semester, but even if you're not, you can still complete all the flight training in your four years at LETU.

Read on for some tips and ways to avoid issues as you select flight courses for each semester.

Flight Course Sequencing (see details on back!)

If you came in without a Private Pilot Certificate, follow this sequence (note this does NOT have to begin with your first semester at LETU):

Semester 1: Flight Science I AERF1113

Semester 2: Primary Flight I AERF1132
Aviation Meteorology AERO2203 (or in Sem 3)

Semester 3: Primary Flight II AERF1142
Aviation Meteorology AERO2203 (or in Sem 2)

Semester 4: Commercial Flight I AERF2311
Flight Science II AERF2103 [must keep with C1]
Aerodynamics for Pilots AERO2113 (or in Sem 5)
Aviation Meteorology AERO2203 (if not done)

Semester 5: Instrument Flight AERF3412
Aerodynamics for Pilots AERO2113 (or in Sem 4)
Flight Science III AERF3103 (or in Sem 6)

Semester 6: Commercial Flight II AERF3111
Flight Science III AERF3103 (or in Sem 5)
Aerodynamics for Pilots AERO2113 (if not done)
Flight Instr Theory AERF4603 (optional, FA only)

Semester 7: Commercial Flight III AERF3662 or 3522
Flight Instr Theory AERF4603 (optional, FA only)

If you came in with a Private Pilot Certificate, follow this sequence (note this does NOT have to begin with your first semester at LETU):

Semester 1: Flight Policies and Standardization AERF1201
Aviation Meteorology AERO2203 (or in Sem 2)

Semester 2: Commercial Flight I AERF2311
Flight Science II AERF2103 [must keep with C1]
Aerodynamics for Pilots AERO2113 (or in Sem 3)
Aviation Meteorology AERO2203 (if not done already)

From here, join the normal sequence listed above starting with Semester 5.

Online Only / On Ground Only Classes

Some courses are only offered online. Here are common courses that are online, allowing flexible schedules:

- AERO2823 Aviation Management
- AERO3153 Aviation Safety Factors
- AERO4163 Aviation Law
- AERO4513 Airport Operations and Management
- AERO4613 Aviation Safety Management Systems
- AERO4823 Aviation Management Capstone

Some classes are only offered on ground (in the classroom):

- AERO3213 Electronic Nav & Flight Control Sys (SP only)
- AERO4133 Crew Resource Management (FA only)
- AERO4603 Flight Instructor Theory (typically FA only)

This is not a complete list, so check course listings carefully!

Summer Flying

Summer flying can be a great way to get ahead with flight training or get caught up if something interrupts your flight training sequence. However, please understand that not all of the courses are offered for summer. Flight Science II is typically offered in summer, but other courses such as Flight Science I and Flight Science III are not. Check course offerings at www.letu.edu for more information about what is offered in summer semesters.

Please come to meetings prepared to talk about your specific questions. Advisors are not here to select your courses for you. We are here to provide advice and guidance.

Please do not try to go to another faculty for advising. We cannot see your full information and will send you to your normal advisor anyway.

Also, when emailing your advisor, **please include your student ID number!** This makes it easier for us to approve your courses and find you in the advising system to give approvals.
